ACADEMIC HONESTY

In the event a student is caught cheating, he/she will fail their class and required to start the class over.

CLOSED CAMPUS

Ashley Valley Education Center has a closed campus policy. Once the student arrives at school, they are to stay on campus until school ends. In the event a student needs to leave school, a parent/guardian is required to check their student out through the front office. Parents are encouraged to not check student out during lunch.

DAYTIME CURFEW

Uintah County has a daytime curfew law that requires all students be at school during school hours. City and County police will enforce this law.

ATTENDANCE EXPECTATIONS

In order to afford students the opportunity to be academically successful they need to follow state and federal guidelines. Students must attend school for 180 days and 990 hours in order to achieve these requirements, students must:

- ✓ Attend school 6 hours each day Monday - Thursday
 - 8:25 am – 2:25pm
- ✓ Daily breaks Monday-Thursday:
 - Break 9:25 – 9:35 am
 - Lunch 11:05 – 11:35 am
 - Break 1:00 – 1:10 pm
- ✓ 3 ½ hours on Friday
 - 8:25am – 12:00 pm
- ✓ Friday Breaks:
 - Break 9:45-10:00
 - Lunch 11:30-12:00

Attendance will be on each trimester. Beginning with each trimester, students will start over with zero absences.

- Students are allowed 4 absences each trimester
 - **Fifth absence of any kind classes are locked and only accessible on campus**
 - **Seventh absence attendance mentor meets with parents**
 - **Ninth absence credit tracking sheet is required by attendance mentor**
 - **Tenth absence students will be referred to lawyer court**
 - **Not compliant with Lawyer court refer to PIP**
- ✓ 3 tardies equal 1 absence
- ✓ 2 check-ins/check-outs equals 1 absence
- ✓ Leaving before 2:00 p.m. equals 1 absence
- ✓ From 8:00 am – 8:10 am equals 1 tardy
- ✓ Returning to class late after breaks and lunch equals 1 tardy
- ✓ Coming to school after 8:10 a.m. equals 1 absence
- ✓ Court does not count as an absence (proof needs to be provided).
- ✓ A funeral does not count as an absence (proof needs to be provided).
- ✓ Medical does not count as an absence (proof needs to be provided).
- ✓ School activities do count as an absence
- ✓ Checkout doesn't require return unless with medical note and then it will be switched to medical excuse

AWOL(Absence without leave)

Students who leave campus without being checked out will be put on the AWOL list. On the third AWOL, students will be reset in their current class. Upon any multiple of 3 AWOL's the student will fail their current class.

EXCUSING STUDENTS FROM SCHOOL

Students may occasionally need to be absent for illness, emergencies, court, etc. In such cases, students may be parent excused by calling **435-781-4675**.

Permitted areas:

- East – doctors' offices
- South – front parking lot

STUDENT PARKING

Students will park in the middle two rows of the front parking lot of the main building. Vehicle searches can be done if there is suspicious behaviors.

BASI TESTING

Every student is tested in Math and Language

- If on grade level no BASI testing rest of the year
- If below grade level remedial math and/or language classes

PROGRESS

Teachers will monitor student's time on task and assist students in setting weekly goals. Interventions will be used to help students complete their classes.

Student minimum progress expectations are:

- Earn .5 credit every two weeks
- Earn 1 credit per month
- Earn 3 credits per trimester
- Earn 9 credits within the school year

Student Progress:

- After 5 days
 - Less than 50% complete is an F
- After 2 weeks
 - 50-99% complete is a .25 credit move-on
 - Teacher discretion for student showing progress
 - Upon the Fourth .25 move on grades will become F's for each .25 move on there after
- Class completion must be met regardless of attendance

If progress is not met:

- First fail
 - Teachers will have made two communications with guardian before first fail.
 - Meeting with student, parent, teacher, counselor (if available), principal (if available), and, mentor.
 - Study skills1 packet will be given and student will go home to work on packet.
 - Three days to complete and return to school for new class.
- Second fail
 - Student will come back to work on career packet on campus.
 - Have a duel meeting with adult education teacher, counselor, principal, mentor, student, and parent.
 - Three days to complete and return to school for new class.
- Third fail
 - Meeting with, parent, student, teachers, counselor, principal, and mentor to decide placement of student. Attendance, behavior, and progress will lead the decision of the team.
 - AVEC, PIP, Home school, Adult education, study skills packet
 - Study skills 2 packet will be given and student will go home.
 - Three days to complete and return to school for new class.
- Fourth fail
 - Enact team decision from fail three.

WARRIOR SCHEDULE

Complete 1 credit in 4 weeks. Student has the option of the warrior schedule or stay on campus. Warrior schedule is given to students who show interest and will be given a goal sheet. Guardian will be notified if student wants warrior schedule.

- Warrior schedule:
 - Daily campus from 9:00-11:00 or 12:00-2:25 Monday-Thursday, Fridays off.
 - Three more hours to be completed at home.
 - .5 Credit needs to be completed every two weeks.
 - No more than five absences every four weeks.
 - ½ test on campus.
 - Students communicate with teachers for testing and opening class sections.
- If not met, back on campus full time. Teacher will have made two contacts when a student is removed and counselor will let parent know he/she is removed from warrior schedule. Earn warrior schedule back again following trimester.

CELL PHONES

- During class hours put in pouches
- Allowed during breaks and lunch

HALL PASSES

- Students must have a hall pass when at school during class time.

CREDIT CUTOFF'S

Upon enrolling into AVEC students must meet required credit expectations or Adult Education will be recommended.

- Juniors = 20 or fewer credits at the first of the school year.
- Juniors = 12 or fewer credits on April 15th
- Seniors = 10 or fewer credits at the first of the school year.

MASTERY

AVHS requires mastery for each class. The percent of mastery is contingent upon recovery or primary credit.

- Recovery credit = class has been previously failed from a traditional high school
 - 70% mastery
- Primary credit = class has never been taken or failed from an alternative school
 - 73% mastery

RETAKES

When a student does not meet mastery on an individual test a retake must occur.

- First and second failed test = free
- Third failed test = teacher intervention
- Fourth failed test = reset unit materials
- Fifth failed test = score received

Course mastery of 70/73% is required; therefore, units may need to be retaken in order to meet mastery expectations.

UINTAH HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITES AND SPORTS

Students in good-standing are welcome to attend after school activities at UHS. Good-standing is based on attendance, behavior, and progress. Students attending AVEC may participate in sports at UHS. Utah High School's Athletic Association eligibility requirements will be enforced.

USU/UBATC CLASSES

UBATC and USU classes will be allowed only after 2:00 pm.

STUDENTS RETURNING TO UINTAH HIGH SCHOOL

Any student who wishes to return to Uintah High School needs to be on track to graduate at a trimester break.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

An Ashley Valley Education Center Diploma will be awarded to any student who has earned the total required units of credits as outlined by Uintah School District Policy and finishes their credits with AVEC. If wanting a Uintah diploma the student will need to transfer to Uintah 3rd trimester and finish their credits there.

GRADUATION CEREMONIES

- Students completing the requirements for high school diploma through the Ashley Valley Education Center program are eligible to participate in Uintah High School's graduation ceremonies and senior activities.
- Ashley Valley Education Center does not provide a graduation ceremony or senior activities.
- Ashley Valley Education Center will have a graduation barbeque for all graduates, family, and friends.

MEDICATION

School policy states that school personnel shall give no pupil medication during school hours except upon written orders from a licensed physician who has the responsibility for the medical management of the pupil, and a written statement from the parent or guardian asking the school to assist the student in taking the medicine. Parents are urged, however, to request that the physician develop a schedule so that the necessity for taking medication at school will be minimized or eliminated. **Students shall not carry or self-administer medication on school premises unless it is expressly ordered the student's physician and is included in a 504 plan.** Violation in this will result in a safe school hearing.

STUDENTS' DRESS CODE

Uintah School Board of Education requires students to avoid extreme, unsafe or inappropriate dress appearance. The following should not be worn:

- Tank tops or shirts with spaghetti straps
- Midriff/belly shirts (no skin should show when raising hands)
- Short shorts or short skirts (lengths must be at least mid-thigh)
- See-thru clothing, too tight, and too low cut
- Clothing with inappropriate language, slogans, and/or pictures (including drugs, alcohol, violence, and silhouettes)
- Anything identified as gang attire
- Display of undergarments (bras and underwear)
- No handbags and book bags are allowed in the classroom. A drawer will be provided in the front office for storage.
- No blankets in classroom
- No ripped pants above the fingertips
- No bandanas
- No cell phones in classroom/or put into pouches
- Interpretations of the standards are the responsibility of school administration

SAFE SCHOOLS, CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Uintah School Board has a strict “Safe School” policy and provides guidelines for dealing with disruptive incidents at school. This gives students right to attend school without undue concern for their physical safety.

Established penalties, citations, and procedures for (according to school district policies):

- Possession of any type of weapon (real, look-alike, and/or pretend)
- Any form of organized gang activity or gang related behaviors
- Destruction, defacement, and vandalism of school/public property
- Use of vulgarity, profanity, and/or gestures
- Direct and willful disobedience of school rules and policies
- Cheating
- Fighting
- Excessive absences/truancy
- Harassment/bullying
- Disruptive clothing
- Conduct in locations away from the school that threatens or does harm to school or persons associated with the school
- Use, possession, or exchange of drugs and alcohol within a 1000 feet of school campus or any school owned property or associated with Uintah School District
- Hazing, demeaning, or assaultive behavior, whether consensual or not

- Frequent or flagrant willful disobedience, defiance of proper authority (including foul, profane, vulgar and/or abusive language)
- Behavior or threatened behavior which poses an immediate and significant threat to the welfare, safety, or morals of other students or school personnel or to the operation of the school

BULLYING AND HAZING

Bullying and/or hazing are intentionally or knowingly committing an act that endangers the physical health or safety of a school employee or student. Students who engage in bullying and/or hazing of any kind in a school setting may be subject to disciplinary action according to School District Policy

SEXUAL HARASSMENT - OF AND BY STUDENTS

Uintah School Board prohibits sexual harassment of or by any student.

Prohibited sexual harassment includes, but not limited to:

- Unwanted sexual advances
- Request for anything that is sexual in nature (including visual, verbal, and/or physical)

Students who engage in sexual harassment of any person in the school setting may be subject to disciplinary action according to School District Policy.

STUDENT TRANSPORTATION

UINTAH ONLINE HIGH SCHOOL **EXPECTATIONS**

ATTENDANCE EXPECTATIONS

In order to afford students the opportunity to be academically successful they need to follow state and federal guidelines. Students must attend school for 180 days and 990 hours. Students may choose to log in and work in school on holiday and weekends to catch up or get ahead in classes. They still must attend school every school day or be marked absent. In order to achieve school attendance requirements, students must:

- ✓ Attend school 5 hours total Monday-Thursday
- ✓ 3 hours total on Friday
- ✓ Attendance will be on trimesters.
 - Students are allowed 4 absences every trimester.
 - Beginning with Trimester, students will start over with zero absences.
- ✓ Students who attend partial days will be marked tardy.
- ✓ Students must complete assignments according to due date
- ✓ 3 tardies equal 1 absence
- ✓ Parent excused count as 1 absence
- ✓ Court does not count as an absence (proof needs to be provided).
- ✓ A funeral does not count as an absence (proof needs to be provided).
- ✓ Medical does not count as an absence (proof needs to be provided).
- ✓ School activities do not count as an absence

EXCUSING STUDENTS FROM SCHOOL

Students are expected to log in each school day according to the Uintah County School District calendar included. Students may occasionally need to be absent for illness, emergencies, court, etc. In such cases, students may be parent excused by calling **435-781-4675**.

Students will be expected to maintain a minimum of 93% attendance. This allows parents to excuse students up to four days per trimester. All absences and tardies, regardless of the excuse, will be factored into the four days allowed. All un-excused absences are considered as trancies.

PROGRESS

The UON teacher will monitor student's time on task and assist students in completing classes on time. Interventions will be used to help students complete their classes.

Student progress expectations are:

- Earn .5 credit every two weeks
- Earn 1 credit per month
- Earn 3 credits per trimester
- Earn 9 credits within the school year

Student Progress:

- After 5 days
 - Less than 50% complete is an F
- After 2 weeks
 - 50-79% complete is an .25 credit move on
 - 80-99% complete teacher discretion move on
 - Upon the Fourth .25 move on grades will become F's for each .25 move on there after

If progress is not met:

- First Fail
 - Student will be required to meet with the UON teacher for one hour each week at Ashley Valley Education Center and will be placed on a monitored success plan.
- Second Fail
 - Student will be required to meet with the UON teacher for two hours each week at Ashley Valley Education Center and will be placed on a monitored success plan.
- Third Fail
 - Student will be removed from the UON and referred to the Adult Education program to complete High School Requirements or take GED.
 - In the event a student needs five or fewer credits to graduate Adult Education will offer a High School diploma or a GED.
 - In the event a student needs more than five credits to graduate Adult Education only offers a GED.

CREDIT CUTOFFS

Upon enrolling into UON students must meet required credit expectations or Adult Education will be recommended.

- Sophomores = 20 or fewer credits at the first of the school year.
- Juniors = 12 or fewer credits on April 15th
- Seniors = 10 or fewer credits at the first of the school year.

MASTERY

UOS requires mastery for each class. The percent of mastery is contingent primary credit.

- Primary credit = class has never been taken or failed from an alternative school
 - 80% mastery
- Students are required to take a minimum of ½ class posttests on campus.
 - Required classes that students must take posttest on campus are Math, Science, English, and History.

RETAKE

When a student does not meet mastery on an individual test a retake must occur.

- First and second failed test = free
- Third failed test = teacher intervention
- Fourth failed test = reset unit materials
- Fifth failed test = score received

Course mastery of 70/80% is required; therefore, units may need to be retaken in order to meet mastery expectations.

PARTICIPATION AT UTAH HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

Students in good-standing are welcome to attend after school activities at UHS. Good-standing is based on attendance, behavior, and progress. Students failing to meet weekly mentoring standards will not be allowed to attend activities including sporting events and dances.

PARTICIPATION IN UHS SPORTS

Students attending AVHS/UON may participate in sports at UHS. Utah High School's Athletic Association eligibility requirements will be enforced.

STUDENTS RETURNING TO UINTAH HIGH SCHOOL

Any student who wishes to return to Uintah High School needs to be on track to graduate at a trimester break.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS
